Lesson 3
Exodus 2:11-25

1. Did you have an occasion to exercise your faith by trusting God this week? Did you learn something new about God and his character that was helpful to you?
2. Read Exodus 2:11-15, Acts 7:20-29, Hebrews 11:24-27. Moses was around 40 years old at this time..
 - Describe the life he had enjoyed “in the palace.” Was it satisfying to him?
 - What sympathies did he hold and what actions did he take that demonstrated he had matured in those 40 years? Did Moses think he was right in killing the Egyptian?
 - What sense of his own destiny did he have? (Acts 7:25) How is Moses an example of right motivation but wrong methods? What was the result?
3. Why do you think God allowed him to fail at this time?
4. Read Exodus 2:16-25. Who were the Midianites and where did they live? (Genesis 25:1-6)
5. What character trait of Moses is repeated in Midian? (v. 17)
6. Why did Moses agree to stay with Reuel and even marry one of his daughters? How was he feeling at this time?
7. Moses would stay in Midian for 40 years. What was he learning during that time that would prepare him to be the deliverer of God’s people?
8. What might God want you to learn before he can more effectively use you?
9. How was God continuing to prepare the Israelites to leave Egypt? In v. 24 we are told that God remembered his covenant with them. Had he forgotten? Why did he wait so long to rescue them?
10. When things are tough, to whom do you cry out?
