Lesson 9
Luke 5:1-26

1. Read Luke 5:1-3. Using these verses, what details does Luke include in describing the setting of what will follow?
2. Read Luke 5:4-11. What did Jesus tell Peter to do? Why would his request seem illogical to Peter?
3. How did Peter respond? Why? What was the result?
4. Look for at least 4 steps in the development of Peter's understanding of Jesus in these eleven verses.
5. What three qualities does Peter exhibit that are necessary for any true servant of God? (vv. 5, 8, 11) What promise did Jesus make to him at the end of v. 10? In what ways do these verses also describe you?
6. Read Luke 5:12-16. Jesus' healing of the leper has obvious parallels to his healing of our sins. How is sin like leprosy? What parallels are there in this account to his healing of one's sin?
7. Why did Jesus ask him to not tell anyone, but to go directly to the priest and offer the proper sacrifices? (Mark 1:43)
8. Read Luke 5:17-26. Who was Jesus teaching in v. 17? What lessons about faith and love can be learned from the friends of the paralytic?
9. By what power did Jesus heal the paralytic? What did he say to him? (vv. 20 and 24) Over what did Jesus demonstrate his power and authority?
10. What true observation did the religious leaders make? What is implied in Jesus' answer to their challenge? (vv. 21-24) What were the responses of the paralyzed man and the rest of the crowd? (vv. 25-26) What is yours?
