Lesson 11
Luke 6:12-38

1. Read Luke 6:12-16. Why did Jesus spend the night in prayer before choosing the twelve apostles? What is the difference between a disciple and an apostle?

2. What can be learned from the choosing of these key men that should be applied to our lives as well – particularly when making a major decision or choice?

3. Read Luke 6:17-19. The previous chapters have established the identity and authority of Jesus. He will now primarily focus on the teaching of his disciples. What lesson was he teaching them by his actions immediately after their calling and before his great sermon?

4. Read Luke 6:20-26. Luke gives a condensed version of the beatitudes (see also Matt. 5:3-12). What does the word “blessed” mean?

5. Luke differs from Matthew’s account in that each “blessed” statement is followed by a contrasting “woe.” Note that the second part of each gives a reason for the blessing or woe. Explain each in your own words realizing that these go beyond material and physical needs to spiritual needs also.

 - Verses 21b, 25b, Luke 19:41-44

 - Verses 22-23, 26

6. Read Luke 6:27-31. *How* are we to love our enemies?

7. Read Luke 6:32-36. *Why* are we to love our enemies?

8. Read Luke 6:37-38. What fundamental principle is taught in these verses that relates to verse 36?
