Lesson 8
Exodus 11:1-12:36

1. Read Exodus 11:1-8. These verses are the continuation and conclusion of Moses' last audience with Pharaoh in chapter 10. What encouragement had God given to Moses about future events? (vs. 1-3) What was God's last plague on Pharaoh and Egypt? When would it happen?

2. What would be the immediate result for the Egyptians? For the Israelites? For the Egyptian officials? For Moses?

3. Why was Moses "hot with anger" when he left Pharaoh?

4. Read Exodus 12:1-13. List all the instructions the Israelites were to carefully follow in order to be spared the judgment of the last plague. Why would God "pass over" the houses of the Israelites?

5. How are we spared God's judgment through Christ our Passover lamb? (John 1:29-36, 8:24, 11:25-26, Romans 3:23-26, 5:8, 6:23)

6. Read Exodus 12:14-20. What instructions were given for the Feast of Unleavened Bread? (vv. 14-16) What did the yeast symbolize? (Matt. 16:6, 1 Cor. 5:6-8) How was this celebration connected to the Passover?

7. What "yeast" needs to go from your life? (2 Cor. 7:1, Heb. 12:1)

8. Read Exodus 12:21-30. What happened on that first Passover night? How costly was Pharaoh's hardened heart?

9. Why were Passover and the Feast of Unleavened bread to be lasting ordinances for the original participants as well as future generations? What parallels can you find between Passover and our celebration of Communion?

10. Read Exodus 12:31-36. Why did Pharaoh summon Moses and Aaron one more time? What did he order them to do? What did he ask them to do for him?

11. How did the Egyptians help them on their way?
