Lesson 10  
Exodus 15:1-17:7

1. Read Exodus 15:1-21. What do you learn about God in these verses? Which is most meaningful to you today?
  
2. Read Exodus 15:22-27. How would you define grumbling? How does God see grumbling? (See also Numbers 17:5, 10; James 5:9) Why were the Israelites grumbling? Who did they blame? What was their real problem?
  
3. How did God solve their water problem? What should they have learned? What conditional promise followed the miracle?
  
4. Verses 15:25 and 16:4 say *that God tested them*. What is the purpose of God's *tests*? How do they differ from Satan's *temptations*?
  
5. Read Exodus 16:1-25. What were they grumbling about in vv. 1-3? What wrong assumptions had they made?
  
6. How did God meet their needs? What exact instructions did he give them? What should they have learned about God?
  
7. Against whom were they grumbling? (vv. 7-8) Have you ever been guilty of the same thing?
  
8. Why do you think God wanted them to gather the manna daily? (Deut. 8:3, Matt. 6:11, John 6:35) How does that instruction apply to us?
  
9. How did some of them fail "the test"? (vv. 20, 27-28) Why?
  
10. Read Exodus 17:1-7. How do you think Moses was feeling at this time? What did he learn?
