Lesson 20  
Luke 10:25-11:13

1. Read Luke 10:25-37. What was the first question the “expert in the law” asked Jesus? Why? How did Jesus respond? The man answered Jesus correctly in v. 27, yet what had he missed (v. 28)?
  
2. Wanting to *justify* himself, what was the second question he asked Jesus?
  
3. Jesus’ replied with “the Parable of the Good Samaritan.” What was the view of the Jewish traveler by each of the characters in this story?
  - Robbers?
  - Priest and Levite?
  - Samaritan?
  - Who was the real neighbor? Why?
  
4. How do you “see” the people you encounter? What was meaningful to you from this parable?
  
5. Read Luke 10:38-42 & Psalm 46:10. Most of us can probably identify with Martha. Where did she go astray? Why was Mary’s the better choice? When was the last time you sat at the feet of Jesus and listened to him?
  
6. Read Luke 11:1-4. The Lord’s Prayer is both a prayer we should pray as well as a pattern for how we should pray. List the key elements of this prayer. How do your prayers measure up to this pattern?
  
7. Read Luke 11:5-13. This parable is often misinterpreted – it is not teaching that if one pesters God long enough he will finally give you what you ask even if he doesn’t want to do so. How does it contrast the character of God with the character of the reluctant neighbor?
  
8. What reasons are we given for having confidence in prayer?
  
9. Why doesn’t God give us everything we ask for?
