Luke 5:27-6:11

1. Read Luke 5:27-32. Why would Levi have been an illogical choice as a disciple? How is his condition similar to that of the leper and the paralytic so that his calling logically “fits” at this place in Luke’s narrative?
2. What was Levi’s two-fold response to Jesus’ call to “follow me”? (vv. 27-29) What was the response of the Pharisees and teachers of the Law?
3. What was Jesus’ answer? (vv. 31-32, 19:10) What did the Pharisees fail to understand?
4. Read Luke 5:33-39. What normally characterized the truly repentant person that was apparently absent in those who followed Jesus?
5. Explain Jesus’ reply to them from each of the following passages:
 - Verses 34-35
 - Verse 36
 - Verses 37-38
6. What point was he making in v. 39? Who preferred the old wine over the new?
7. Read Luke 6:1-5. It was legal for a Jew to eat from a neighbors field (Deut. 23:25), so on what basis did the Pharisees accuse the disciples of breaking the Law?
8. How did Jesus reply to the accusations? What does it mean that, “The Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath.”
9. Read Luke 6:6-11. Why did Jesus choose to heal the man with the shriveled hand on the Sabbath at the synagogue? Did he break the law? Why or why not?
10. What increasing hardness of heart is seen in the Pharisees? (See also Mark 3:1-6)
