1 Corinthians – Lesson 11
1 Corinthians 10:1-11:1

1. Read 1 Corinthians 10:1-13. Paul wants his readers to be warned by the history of Israel. What privileges had been given them? (vv. 1-4) Yet, what was the result? What privileges have been given to us? Why don't they guarantee our lives will please God?

2. What sins of Israel were written down by Paul as warnings to us? (vv. 6-10) How had their forefathers "tested the Lord"? (See also Exodus 17:1-7, Numbers 21:4-9)

3. We are not all that different from ancient Israel. How do we manifest these same sins today?

4. How does Paul counter the false idea that some temptations are just too strong to be resisted?

5. Read 1 Corinthians 10:14-22. How does Paul warn them to flee idolatry by thinking about the reality behind "ideal feasts" and the "Lord's Supper." Why are they totally incompatible?

6. Read 1 Corinthians 10:23-11:1. What principles should guide our behavior as Christians?

7. How seriously do we as Christians take the command to do *all for the glory of God*? For that to really become the guiding principle of your life, what practical changes could you make?
